Washington Redskins Controversy

Background

- The Washington Redskins were an NFL team from Washington DC
- After years of controversy surrounding their name and logo, they changed their name to the Washington Football Team
- Many people, including some Native Americans, feel that the name and logo is an honor and source of pride to them
- Many say the name and logo are offensive, racist slur, and characaturizing Native Americans



Perspective of Native Americans:

- According to a study by the Annnenberg Public Policy Center from 2004, as well as a 2016 poll by the Washington Post, **9 in 10 Native Americans said they were NOT offended by the Washington Redskins name**
- According to a 2019 study by Berkeley, 49% of Native Americans polled said that the Washington Redskins name WAS offensive
