Duties as Americans, Jews, and Zionists





Initial Questions

- Do you feel connected to the conflict?
 - Through what? Jewish communities? Humanitarian causes?
- How have you learned about the issue? Do you feel
 - knowledgeable?
- Is there anything you've learned in History that reminds you of
 - the conflict?



History + Overview

1991 - Soviet Union collapsed and became Russia (what it is today)

1990s - Ukrainian independence from Soviet Union

2014 - After violence within Ukraine over their government, parliament installed a new interim government, which vows to join the EU

2014 - Russia annexes Crimea, a part of Ukraine

2019 - Current Ukrainian president elected, Volodymyr Zelenskyy (Jewish), who shows interest in the West and joining NATO

2021 - Russian presence on the Ukrainian border increases - up to 100,000 troops.

2022 - Talks of invasion grow, diplomatic efforts attempted,

- February 24th - Russian forces begin military-scale invasion of Ukraine, **the largest military operation in Europe since the end of WW2**



American Positions

- Isolationist – Before World War II, this was the main American position; it advocates for <u>minimal involvement</u> in international affairs–essentially, we should not get involved in the Ukraine conflict, or do so minimally if we must.

- Sanctions - Only use monetary and trade sanctions to attempt to discourage Russia with minimal involvement

- Aid – Sending aid, such as money, supplies, arms, or munitions to foreign countries, but <u>not</u> physical soldiers.

- Full-scale Direct military involvement including vehicles, weapons, and most importantly, <u>soldiers</u>.
- Or something else!



As Americans...

- Do we have a moral obligation to help Ukraine? Why and how?
 - Money, arms, munition, soldiers, humanitarian aid, etc.
 - What about other countries?
- Should we still get involved in the conflict if it makes life harder at home?
 - Ex: gas prices rising, stock market affected



As Jews...

- Do you feel a stronger connection to this issue because of WW2?
- How should we respond to Putin's claim to "de-Nazify" Ukraine?
 - Is this claim especially alarming or just used for politics?
 - Why do you think Putin used this language? What does it mean/imply?
- Does the fact that the Ukrainian President is Jewish affect your view at all?
 - Does it become a priority?



As Zionists...

- Israel abstained from the first UN vote to condemn Russia; but a few days ago <u>did</u> condemn.
- What do you think about Israel's long unspoken neutrality in this conflict up until very recently?
- Helping Ukraine could hurt Israeli relations with Russia; should Israel do the "moral" thing or prioritize self-preservation?
